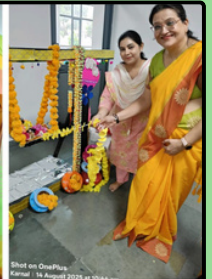
FATHER'S DAY CELEBRATION

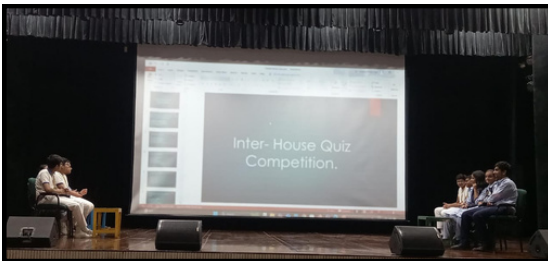
HEALTHY SMILES , HEALTHY FUTURE

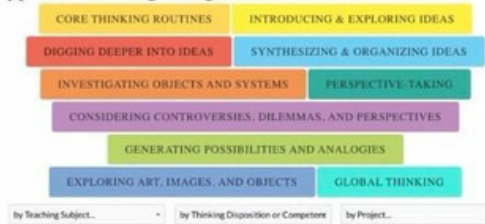
ENGAGE, LEARN, INSPIRE: ACTIVE LEARNING WORKSHOP
